LIVE FROM THE SHOW FIELD

Our old Pennant Blue '54 now owned by our friend Dave has completed two of the three certifications required for the coveted Triple Crown® award. In May, it was awarded a National Top Flight award by the National Corvette Restorers Society (NCRS) at their meet in Auburn, IN. Then in June, the car was judged at the Bloomington Gold Corvette show in St. Charles, IL and was awarded Bloomington Gold®. Chuck & Karen provided on-site assistance at both shows. Still to come is the Chevy Vettefest in Chicago, IL where it will compete for the Gold Spinner® award. If it wins, it is then awarded the "Triple Crown", considered the ultimate in certification for Corvette. The three judged events differ in some of their rules and standards, however, all share a common goal of recognizing the most original, correct and authentic from-the-factory condition of the given year. Yes, these are the judges that count the number of bumps on the choke cable, check the threads on the exhaust clamps and assess the grain of the seat covers, door panels and convertible top. '54 Corvettes are particularly difficult to certify as many changes were made during the production year, so what is considered "correct" can only be assessed in conjunction with the vehicle's VIN. The blue '54 is considered a "later" production car, most commonly recognized by the "teapot" air cleaners and long exhaust.

OLD MUSCLE/NEW MUSCLE GARAGE TOUR

95 people – 95 degrees – 95% humidity

Despite the downright uncomfortable heat, the Old Muscle/New Muscle Garage tour was a big hit. Al Ferrara wowed the crowd with a bunch of Duesenbergs - including the Clark Gable/SSJ (the epitome of "Old Muscle") and two very rare Antiques - a huge 1911 Locomobile Touring car and 1912 Packard Gentleman's Roadster.
